## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

**Today is the First Sunday of Advent**, and it seems like only yesterday that I wrote about Advent for last year's bulletin. Again, Advent is a period of preparation for our annual celebration of Christmas and for the eventual Second Coming of Christ and the end of time. Many people approach Christ's Second Coming with fear and horror. After all, they say, it's the end of the world and life, as we know it! Perhaps you will recall all of the hype that surrounded the turn of the Millennium when we completed 2000 years and began the next 1000-year period. Remember the *Y2K Crisis*, and all the fear it generated-how would we survive? And after all that nothing happened. Remember all of the movies that came out in 1999, which dealt with the year 2000, and the theme that it was the end of the world. Notice how most of these movies portrayed a war between heaven and hell, and some even had hell winning.

There is only one thing to say about the Devil triumphing over God, **RIDICULOUS!**

The true question is why have any fear? In the words of Jesus, "Fear is useless, what is needed is trust." As Christians, we should all be looking forward for Christ to come again. In fact, we pray for it every day in the *Lord's Prayer* and at *The Memorial Acclamation at the Eucharistic Prayer*. We really can't wait for Christ to come again because when He comes the Kingdom of God will be fully established and all of the promises of Christ will be fulfilled. It is everything we have been working for since Christ came into the world, suffered and died on the Cross, rose from the dead, and sent the Holy Spirit upon the Church at Pentecost.

Yes, it presents us with a great challenge as to how well we have lived our lives, and how we must amend our lives so we can be ready for the Second Coming. Yes, we are challenged as to how well we have shared our gifts and Christ with others. During the first two weeks of Advent, we will focus on the Second Coming, and we will look at our lives, our successes and failures, and of course our need for God. During the second two weeks, we will focus on His first coming, and we will prepare ourselves to celebrate with great joy and a new sense of purpose Jesus' birth at Bethlehem.

**On Wednesday December 8<sup>th</sup>** the Church celebrates throughout the world the *Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. This is a Holy Day of Obligation and the Masses for this great day are: Tues. Evening Dec. 7<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 PM; Weds Dec. 8<sup>th</sup> at 7 AM, 9 AM, 12:10 PM, 5 PM, and 7:30 PM. Following the 7:30 PM Mass on Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>, we will have a *Holy Hour for Life* (from 8:20-9:20 PM). During this time, before the exposed Blessed Sacrament, we will pray for an end

of abortion, for all of the victims of abortion, and for the respect and sanctity of all human life from womb to natural death. Please join us for this special hour of prayer.

During the 3<sup>rd</sup> Week of Advent, we will have **3 Evenings of Prayer and Reflection conducted by the priests of the parish. Mark your calendars for December 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup>, -Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of that special week when we change our focus from the 2<sup>nd</sup> to the 1<sup>st</sup> Coming of Christ. These will start at 8 PM and will run from 45 mins. to an hour.** Again, we are asking for pictures of your family to place on our Altar for the *Feast of the Holy Family*, which this year is Sun. Dec. 26<sup>th</sup>-the day after Christmas. Please send to the Rectory a family picture and send it to me Fr. Mike. **On Sunday January 9, 2005 we will celebrate the Feast of the Baptism** of the Lord-the last day of the Christmas Season. We invite all the families of those Infants and Young Children who were baptized in 2004 to the **12 Noon Mass** for a very special blessing-fellowship will follow in Carew Hall after the Mass. This special event is being sponsored by our *Baptismal Greeters*. *The Baptism Greeters Ministry* is a very special ministry whose members are present at our Sunday Baptisms. They help the families find their places, organize the celebration and assist the priest or deacon at the ceremony. They also sew the White Baptismal Bibs that are given to the infants at the ceremony. Thank you, for all that you do in this vital ministry and if you were thinking about helping at the Church this could be the ministry for you. Either fill out the form at the back of this bulletin or leave a message at the Rectory.

Don't forget the *Lighting of the Outside Parish Christmas Tree(s)*, on Saturday Evening Dec. 4<sup>th</sup> right after the 5PM Mass or *Breakfast with St. Nicolas* on Saturday Dec. 11<sup>th</sup> from 9-11:30 AM (see this bulletin for more details, as well as the recent parish mailing). **RESPECT LIFE**

Last week, in quoting from Betsy Hart’s article in the Chicago Sun-Times of 3/25/01, we were talking about the abortion activists’ campaign of disinformation. Nowhere was this revealed more than in the debate over partial-birth abortion, the gruesome procedure in which a very likely viable infant is delivered feet first, but its’ skull is crushed and brain removed before it technically enters the world. Leaders in the abortion-rights movement, rightly afraid that Americans would recoil from all abortion when they found out about this horrific act, told us that 1) the procedure is rarely performed 2) the baby feels nothing because the pain is killed by the anesthesia given to the mother, and 3) that this type of abortion is done only when medically necessary.

The executive director of the National Abortion Federation finally debunked the first myth, and the American College of Anesthesiologists quickly corrected the second. (The unborn child does feel pain). When it came to the third, the generally pro-choice American Medical Association said simply that the procedure “is never medically necessary.”

The biggest difference between the two movements, pro-life and pro-choice, is when it comes to the issue of rights. Fighting for the legitimate rights of oneself or others is a noble act. But while the pro-life activists fight for the lives and rights of both mother and child, the abortion activists fight for a perversion of rights in claiming that one innocent life must die for another. 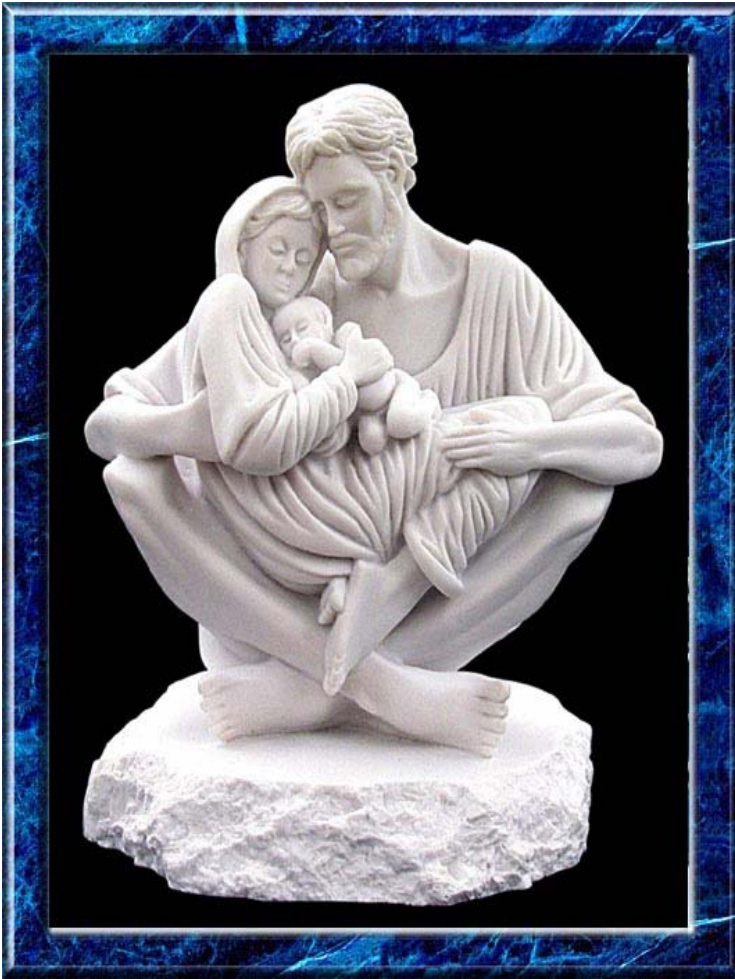

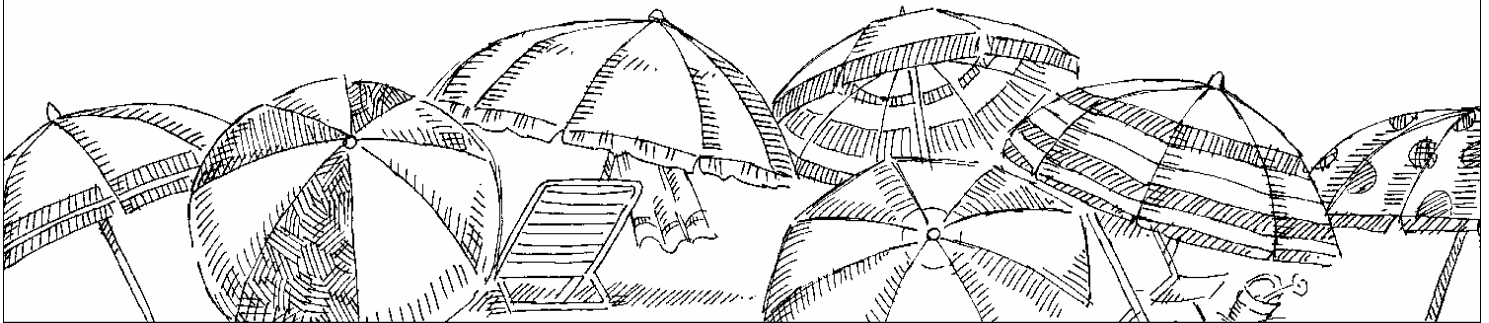
