## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

While I was preparing for this week's homily, I came upon this story about the conductor/composer *Leonard Bernstein*. He was asked which instrument was most difficult to play. He replied, "...the second fiddle. I can get plenty of first violinists, but to find someone who can play the second fiddle with enthusiasm, that's a problem. *And, if we have no second fiddle, we have no harmony.*"

What we get from Paul's Letter to The Corinthians, is some in the community were likewise having trouble being good 2<sup>nd</sup> violinists, being humble and accepting who they were before God and others. They had been given much and were walking around as if they were responsible for what they had gained though Christ. Paul had pointed out to them that they were not wise, powerful, or of noble birth, and yet God gave them everything. They were once foolish and weak, and now they are wise and strong all through Jesus-so why boast? Rather seek to use every gift God has given to you and make the world a harmonious place. The same is true for us, if Christ is the first fiddle; we need to be the **2<sup>nd</sup> fiddle**, playing the proper harmony so that we can do our part to spread the good news. The way we do this is to follow a life that has the **Beatitudes** as its musical score.

The Beatitudes should not be looked at as some promise of future bliss or heavenly glory. Rather we should see them as  **blessings that exist here and now**. But some may ask how can they be considered blessings? When we look at the Beatitudes, they contradict our society's common sense way of life. Our society tells us that the happy ones are those who are wealthy, have the right clothing or drive the best cars. But the Beatitudes call those who are poor, who struggle for righteous, or work for peace, and who are meek as the ones who are truly happy and blessed! Why, and why would or should people endure this type of life? Well because Jesus said so! Yes, He did, because when we follow the Beatitudes, we are correctly told how to focus on God, and how to do good for others and what will truly make us happy. Jesus tells us to follow this series of *8 Blessings* so we can be more Christ and other-centered and less material and self-centered. Pray about it!

**Wednesday February 9<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday**, and on this day, we will mark our foreheads with ashes from last year's burnt palm, as a sign that we are dying to ourselves only to be raised up with Christ on Easter Sunday. We have a special prayer service on Tuesday evening February 8<sup>th</sup> beginning at 7PM with Hot Cross Buns and Coffee, followed at 7:30 PM by a powerful prayer service and the distribution of ashes. On Ash Wednesday we will have our usual 7 and 9 AM Masses with ashes being distributed after the homily (and not before), and then we will have prayer services with ashes at: 12:10 PM, 4 PM, and 7:30 PM. From the Thursday following Ash Wednesday till Wednesday of Holy Week we will celebrate Mass at 12:10 PM (Mon-Fri.). Every Lenten Friday Evening we will have Stations of the Cross at 7:30 PM.

On the weekend of February 26 & 27, a representative from Food for The Poor will speak at all of the Masses about the worthwhile work they do to assist the world's poor.

Mark your calendars for **St. Joseph's Feast Day** on **Saturday March 19<sup>th</sup>**. Due to the way Easter is falling this year, this day is the Saturday of Palm Sunday weekend and the beginning of Holy Week. Therefore, this year we will not have a big parish party or our International Night. But don't think we are going to forget our Patron Saint! On March 19<sup>th</sup>, we will have a festive brunch to celebrate this important day for our parish. Look for more details in future bulletins.

*Respect Life*

Can you believe this – government funding accounted for 33% of Planned Parenthood’s \$810 million income in 2003-04. They have aborted 138 children for each adoption; they sold the RU486 abortion pill over 95,000 times at 203 clinics; surgical abortions rose to 244,628; and an estimated \$104 million of their \$302.6 million clinic income is attributed to surgical abortions. These facts come from PP’s 2003-04 Annual Report as analyzed by Jim Sedlak, the President of STOPP, a group dedicated to keeping a close watch on that organization.

Planned Parenthood has a special task force to study how it will continue if Roe v. Wade is ever overturned. One of the options they are considering is providing abortions where federal laws do not apply. These locations include Native American reservations, ships offshore (similar to the Women on the Waves initiative) and opening affiliates along the border in Canada. In communities all across the U.S., PP pushes itself as the provider of medically accurate sexuality education for our young people. PP gets into schools, Girl Scout troops, 4-H clubs and elsewhere, portraying itself as “healthcare professionals”.

## Backward Drawing Results

When we moved the Backward Drawing from November to the end of January, we thought that we would be more successful with the drawing if we moved it away from the Thanksgiving - Christmas season into the relative quiet of late January.

The goal has always been to generate about \$35,000 for the parish. This was only possible with sponsors underwriting the cost of the party. In the past we were very fortunate to have the over \$2,000 cost covered.

This year, things have been tight for us all. The ticket sales ran behind our hopes. After 9 weeks of sales, we had sold just over half of the tickets. A few of our parishioners pitched in and approached many of our local businesses. We all owe a thanks to those businesses who stepped up: Pop's Deli, Curves, Long Island Grill, Gino's, Island Iron Motorcycles and B&W Auto Repair among others. One business stands out, Mr. Joe Weber of Weber Funeral Home was asked, "can you help us?", the next day he presented us with a \$1,500 check, making a number of his tickets out to the parish and parish outreach. Sadly, one large business informed us that they were actively donating to another school and parish so

they could not help us. Thanks to these efforts, in the last two weeks sales reached 419 tickets sold.

When we were not able to have the party, Fr Maffeo decided that rather than awarding prizes as percentages of the pool, as we had advertised and promised, we would give the maximum prizes as if we had collected all the money we wanted to since we would not have to cover the party cost. This meant \$10,000 instead of \$8,420; \$200 instead of \$168.40, etc.

We invited those at the 12 o'clock mass on Sunday to join us after mass to witness the drawing. In a short two and a half hours, we were done. After the first ticket (a cash prize) was pulled, we inserted the 79 unsold tickets.

We thank those who supported the Drawing. We collected \$42,100, the printing cost \$200, we gave \$14,800 in prizes. The parish made \$27,100.

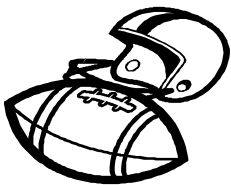

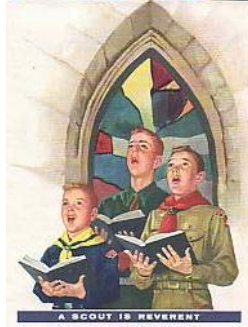

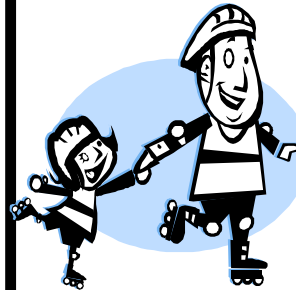
