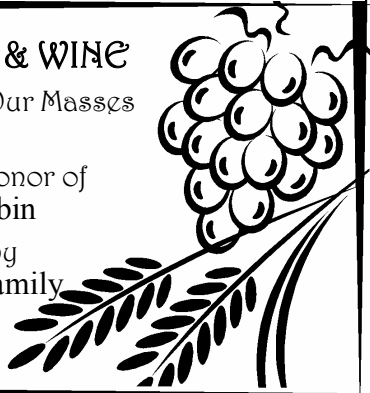

## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

Today's readings present us with Divine Impossibilities-that is something which is completely possible for God, but **nearly** impossible for us. Nearly, because with God all things are possible, and so if we follow Paul's advise they can be possible for us. For if we can say from the bottom of our hearts that Life is Christ, then we can understand that death is indeed gain-for in death we achieve eternal life. We can truly understand Paul's problem-yes, I want to stay here and do all my best for Christ and those whom I love, but I also want to go to heaven and be with God!

We see the Divine impossibility also at work in the Gospel when Jesus says, "*Thus the last will be first, and the first will be last.*" This does not make sense for those who don't have Christ as their life. For when Christ is our life, we can truly understand the message of Jesus' parable and be reminded of the reward awaiting us in the Kingdom of Heaven, and how God's generosity is extended to all. Time and time again we see that the Father sent the Son into the world so all could be saved, that includes those who have known God/Christ all of their lives and those who might only truly know God for a short part of their lives.

Most people would say that this is not fair. Why should a person who has only known God for ½ or ¼ of their lives be given the same access to God and heaven? After all, I have known and been loyal to God my whole life, shouldn't I get more? But remember what God says through *the Prophet Isaiah: My ways are not your ways!* So, the answer to that question, from the God who loves us more than anything, is yes. Yes, it is entirely fair for me to offer salvation to those who have only known me for a short period of time. And how could we or anybody else not want to see salvation extended to all. Like God, we should want to see all get to heaven. When Christ is our life, we can answer yes, without reservations, and seek to do all we can to help others come to know Christ.

Last weekend we welcomed to Saint Joseph's, our new Pastoral Year Seminarian *Mr. Lachlan Cameron*, and our new *Associate Pastor Fr. Rene O. Tapel*. Lachlan will spend the next 10 months with us just as Lee did last year and we are very happy to have him with us as we help this fine young man prepare for the priesthood. I know he will have a wonderful year here for he will learn from the best teachers-the people of St. Joseph's.

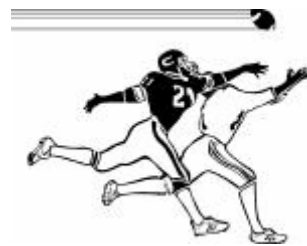
