


OUR LITURGY

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

Samuel as a young boy sleeping in the Temple Area heard the voice of God and did not know whom it was who was calling him. At first, he thought it was his mentor **Eli** calling him, but it was not. Even Eli did not immediately realize who was doing the calling until the 3rd time Samuel went to him. When Samuel finally does answer God, we see that God develops this calling into a life-long relationship in which Samuel will offer God service upon service. Samuel served as a *Judge of Israel*, and Samuel who anointed Saul king and then David when God's favor leaves Saul. Samuel is living in the Temple Area because his mother **Hannah** (who prayed to God to have a child, who she would dedicate to Divine Service) brought him there to learn from Eli and carry out the promised religious vocation. But as we see in the account, God calls Samuel to a deeper vocation, deeper than the one he was already in. Samuel, by God's invitation, is given a **change of perspective** to not just serve God in a local shrine, but to enter into Israel's politics and be God's Official Spokesman!

In John's Gospel, we read all about the call of the 1st Disciples. They are already serving in religious vocation in the fact they are following *John the Baptist*, and most certainly their interest is peaked when John points out Jesus and says-**behold the Lamb of God** and their new Rabbi. After they spend the whole day with Jesus, they realize that they too have been given a **change of perspective**-as they are now called to a deeper relationship with God and are given new avenues to offer service. They are no longer disciples of the forerunner; they are now disciples of the Christ. While at first they may not totally understand who Jesus is, they are very excited about this encounter. In fact, they are so excited that they go out and spread the good news with others, as Andrew calls his brother Simon to come and meet Jesus.

There is another story of a call within a call and it takes place in the life of a young woman in what was then *Yugoslavia*. **Agnes Bojaxhiu** learned at a young age to care deeply for the sick and the poor. At 18, she joined the *Loreto Sisters* and after she made her vows, she went to teach in a girl's school in *Calcutta*. After 19 years of teaching, while on a trip to *Darjeeling* (where she was recuperating from tuberculosis) she had an experience that helped her have a **change of perspective**. She revealed, "It was on a train that I heard the call to give up all and follow Him to the slums, to serve Him in the poorest of the poor." In her response to her call within a call, she founded the **Missionaries of Charity** in 1950, and brought to the world's

attention the plight of the poor in India and throughout the whole world. That sister was, **Mother Teresa of Calcutta!**

Judges, Apostles, Saints what wonderful examples they provide us with, and I am sure we can all come up with

stories from the lives of our favorite saints. Who does not like hearing stories about the saints, how comforting they

are, and how safe they are-**safe, in the sense that at times we can use the fact that they are saints to excuse ourselves when we fail to do as they did!** We excuse ourselves because we say they were saints and they were given a special call from God, that call within a call, but surely not me! Wrong! Of course, God is calling you and each and every one of us. We through Baptism are given the 1st call, but all of us are given the 2nd call in the state of life we enter into. Some have received the 2nd call in the form of Ordained Ministry or the Religious Life. For some the 2nd call comes in the form of Marriage or even the single life (with a life focused on service to others, not to just one person). The Father and The Son, through the power of The Holy Spirit calls each of us to use our Baptismal and Confirmation Gifts in unique ways which help us and other to have a **change of perspective!**

This weekend we start our kickoff for **The Annual Catholic Ministries Appeal**. This Appeal is very important to the life of the Church in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. All of the money collected goes to support the various ministries in the Diocese (including Catholic Charities, Catholic Schools, **The Seminary of the**

Immaculate Conception [for the training of Priests, Deacons, and Lay Leaders for the Church]) and Parish Support on the amount of rebates given back to the parish. Remember every donation made goes to helping our brothers and sisters throughout the whole Diocese in a way that no individual or even single parish can do. So many times people just make a smaller single gift because they want to get it over quickly! While we certainly are grateful for any gift that is given, we do ask that you take your time to pray about what you might be able to give and remember that you can pay your gift over a period of 10 months. If you pledge \$100, you can make a down payment of \$10 and pay off \$10 a month for the next 9 months. \$200 likewise can be payments of \$20 over a 10-month period. That's less than going to McDonalds. Please think and pray about your support and realize that the more that is donated, the more St. Joseph's receives back as well-thank you.

Next Monday January 23rd, is the Annual March for Life March in Washington, as we will have bus leaving St. Joseph's immediately following a special Mass at **4:30 AM** for those making the trip or for those who can't make the trip, but want to offer their support.

The last week of this month is **Catholic Schools Week** come and see all that our Beautiful St. Joseph's School has to offer, and what a wonderful change of perspective

RESPECT LIFE

South Dakota is one of only three states in the United States – North Dakota and Mississippi are the other two – which have only one abortion provider, because of a

strong

anti-abortion lobby. The South Dakota legislature passed five laws this year restricting abortion after a bill to ban abortion outright failed by one vote in 2004. New laws are virtually assured for 2006. A 17-member task force made up largely of abortion opponents issued recommendations early in December 2005 which included some of the most restrictive requirements for abortion in the country.

The report recommends a law that gives fetuses the same protection children get after birth, thus banning abortion. Until such a ban, the task force recommends requiring that a woman contemplating aborting her baby watch an ultrasound of the baby and that doctors warn women about the dangers of abortion.

As national leaders on both sides of the abortion debate focus on the upcoming Supreme Court nomination hearings of Samuel Alito, they are watching states such as South Dakota pass more and more restrictions that might be upheld by a newly constituted, more conservative Supreme Court, although Mary Spaulding Balch,

director of the state legislation department of the National Right to Life campaign, said South Dakota is only one of many states that have had success in passing laws the organization has been espousing for more than 30 years. Because of these laws, and the tireless people working toward the reversal of Roe v. Wade, there is but one Planned Parenthood abortion site in all of that state, and the doctors who work there must fly in from Minnesota, as no doctor in South Dakota is available for that type of work. (This is good, but one wonders how even one abortion facility can operate if abortion is banned. The same situation applies to North Dakota and Mississippi.)






