


OUR LITURGY

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

The Lord is risen, alleluia. We have reached the day we have been preparing for during the entire Season of Lent, and now we are ready to celebrate the new life Christ has gained for us in The Resurrection from The Dead. As I was preparing for this day and the great 50 Days that follow, I came across this ancient homily, "The Lord Descends into Hell," given on Holy Saturday that tells us what it is we are celebrating in the Paschal Mystery!

"Something strange is happening-there is a great silence on earth today, a great silence and stillness. The whole earth keeps silence because the King is asleep. The earth trembled and is still because God has fallen asleep in the flesh and he has raised up all who have slept ever since the world began. God has died in the flesh and hell trembles with fear. He has gone to search for our first parents, as for a lost sheep. Greatly desiring to visit those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death, he has gone to free from sorrow the captives Adam and Eve, He who is both God and the Son of Eve. The Lord approached them bearing the cross, the weapon that had won him the victory. At the sight of him Adam, the first man he had created, struck his breast in terror and cried out to everyone: 'My Lord be with you all.' Christ answered him: 'And with your spirit.' He took him by the hand and raised him up saying: 'Awake, O sleeper, and rise from the dead, and Christ will give you light.'

I am your God, who for your sake have become your son. Out of love for you and for your descendants I now by my own authority command all who are held in bondage to come forth, all who are in darkness to be enlightened, all who are sleeping to arise. I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead for I am the life of the dead. Rise up, work of my hands, you who were created in my image. Rise, let us leave this place, for you are in me and I am in you; together we form only one person and we cannot be separated.

For your sake I, your God, became your son; I, the Lord, took the form of a slave; I, whose home is above the heavens, descended to the earth and beneath the earth. For your sake, for the sake of all, I became like a man without help free among the dead. For the sake of you, who left a garden, I was betrayed...in a garden and was crucified...

...Rise, let us leave this place. The enemy led you out of the earthly paradise. I will not restore you to that paradise, but I will enthrone you in heaven...The

bridal chamber is adorned, the banquet is ready, the eternal dwelling places are prepared, the treasure houses of all good things lie open. The kingdom of heaven has been prepared for you from all eternity."

Jesus Christ the source of our joy, life, and consolation has risen from the dead and so have we, Jesus has destroyed sin and darkness and now we live as children of the light. Share the good news with all who you see today, tomorrow and every day!

Next Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday, April 23rd, and we will hold *The Divine Mercy Holy Hour at 3PM in the Church with praying the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy before the Exposed Blessed Sacrament and Benediction.* Please come out and join us in this very special hour of prayer. As we approach the end of April and the Month of May, we will be celebrating with our people in level 2 and 2nd Grade the great event of *First Communion.* Please pray for our young people and their families as they move closer to Jesus through receiving Him in the Blessed Sacrament. Let us also pray for all of our teachers who prepared them for this great day.

On Saturday April 29th, from 9 AM-2PM we will have a day of prayer for those who are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EM's) at the *Cenacle Retreat House*-more details in the bulletin.

On behalf of Fathers, Thomas, Boyle, Rene, and Peter Liu; our Deacons James Altonji, Joseph Califano, Michael DeBellis, Michael Devenney, and Joseph Dougherty; Seminarian Lachlan Cameron; and our Parish Staff we want to wish you a very Holy and Happy Easter.

Let us pray: All powerful and ever-living God your only Son went down among the dead and rose again in glory. In your goodness, raise up your faithful people, buried with Him in Baptism, to be one with Him in the eternal life of Heaven, where He lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen

RESPECT LIFE

On March 1st, the NYS Assembly *unanimously* passed S.5999-A by Senator John DeFrancisco (R-Onondaga), a bill to educate and invest in the lifesaving treatments provided by umbilical cord blood stem cells.

Hailing the passage of the bill, Sen. DeFrancisco stated, "Cord blood stem cell research provides an ethical and highly beneficial alternative to the controversial research involving embryonic stem cells." He continued, "While individuals are debating the ethics of stem cell research, let's not miss out on an opportunity to save lives by postponing research and let's start utilizing umbilical cord blood stem cells. By encouraging research with cord blood stem cells we *can* treat disease, find cures and save lives".

Sen. DeFrancisco said that the good news doesn't end there. "Governor Pataki, in his 30-day budget amendments, included \$250,000 for Upstate Medical Center to study the creation of a cord blood center. It is my hope that those funds will be part of our final budget so that this lifesaving center will become a reality in Central New York," he said.

While several members of the Senate (namely Sen. Liz Krueger (D-NYC) and Sen. Tom Duane (D-NYC) used the passage of the cord blood bill to advocate for state funding for embryonic stem cell research, all 53 Senators present in the Senate Chamber voted in favor of the cord blood bill on March 1st.

The focus now turns to the State Assembly, where Sen. DeFrancisco's bill is sponsored by Assemblyman Joseph Lentol (D-Brooklyn) and is numbered A.457-A. The bill sits in the Assembly Health Committee. Please urge your Assembly representative to support this vital lifesaving legislation. 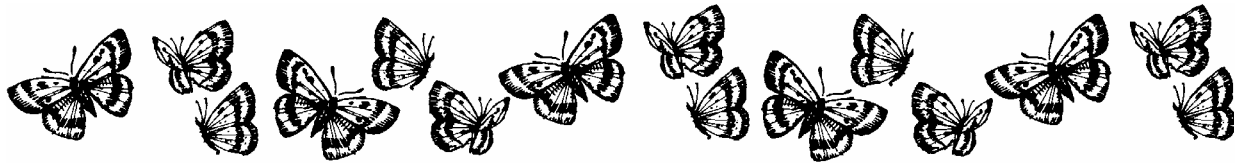

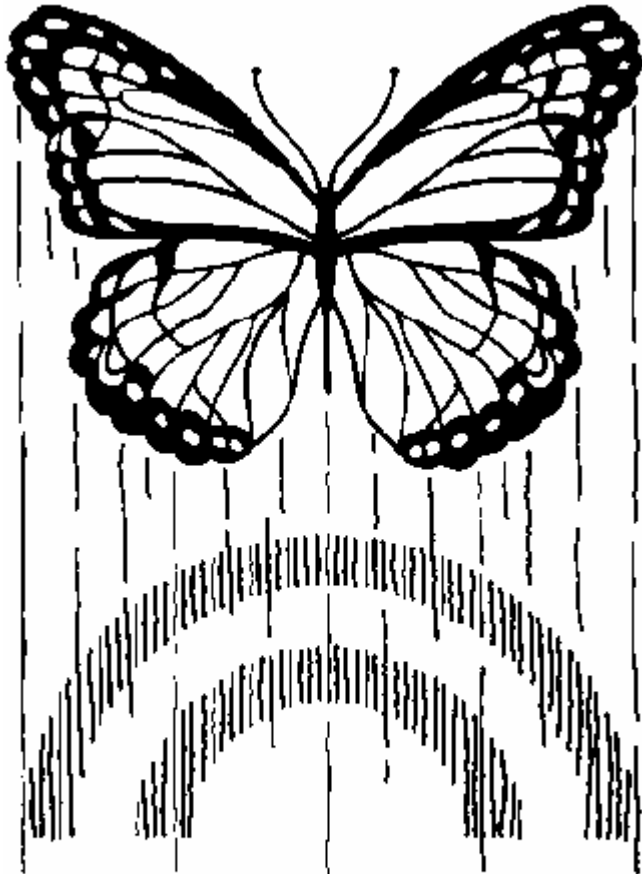

The Image of the Divine Mercy

The Hour of Great Mercy

Our Lord asked for a special prayer at the hour that recalls His death: “At Three o’clock implore My mercy, specially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion.... This is the hour of great mercy.... In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that make a request of Me in virtue of My Passion (Diary, 1320)

His Promise for the Feast of Divine Mercy...

“The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (Diary, 699)

He also made clear to St. Faustina that, “I demand from your deeds of Mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere” (Diary, 742)

Divine Mercy Sunday

During the course of Jesus’ revelations to Saint Faustina, He asked that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy on the Sunday after Easter Sunday. The liturgical texts of that day center around the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of Divine Mercy, were well suited to the request of Our Lord. This feast was granted to the universal Church by Pope John Paul II at the canonization of Saint Faustina.

In a decree dated 23 May 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated, “throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come.”

How to say the Chaplet:

1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and The Apostles Creed.

2. Then on the Our Father Beads say the following:
Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

3. On the 10 Hail Mary Beads say the following:
For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

(Repeat step 2 and 3 for all five decades).

4. Conclude with *(three times):*
Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

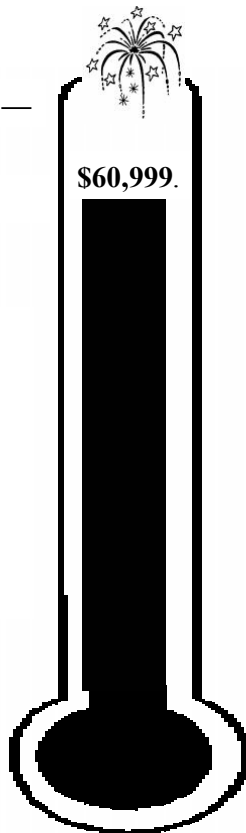
