


OUR LITURGY

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

"Then he said to them, 'Why are you troubled? Look at my hands and feet that it is I myself.

Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have.'"

Today's gospel reading takes place also on that 1st Easter Sunday after the 2 disciples had encountered the **Risen Jesus** on the *Road to Emmaus*. Recall how Jesus came up to them, but they did not recognize Him, because He had changed. Recall how Jesus explained everything in the Scriptures that dealt with the Messiah and how He had to suffer and die and how their hearts were burning inside them as He told them how this would save the whole world. This is also brought out in our 2nd reading from *John's 1st Letter* in which he writes, *"He is the expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only, but for those of the whole world."* As the gospel account continues, the 2 disciples, when they sat at table with this stranger had their eyes opened when He took the bread from the table and broke it and then He vanished. They rushed back to *Jerusalem* where they found the others including the Apostles and our Dear Blessed Mother, and suddenly Christ appeared in the room and they were very much afraid. And who could blame them?

They did not know what to make of these events, after all this has never happened before that a man has died and has come back from the dead. But what about Lazarus or the dead son of the widow of Nain or Jarius' daughter they were brought back from the dead by Jesus, shouldn't that have been proof for them that He was not a ghost? Yes, you would think, but remember they were returned to this life and thus would die again, so it was not the same thing! We may say, look, we read these accounts every year and we know that Jesus is not a ghost or like Lazarus or the others mentioned above, why couldn't they know what we know? Well we have the one thing they did not yet have on that 1st Easter Sunday, and that is the Holy Spirit. This is important, because it is the Holy Spirit who constantly communicates to us who Jesus truly is—the Son of God made one of us. The Holy Spirit would not come upon the early Church until some 40 days later from that 1st Easter Sunday. So, they are afraid, until they truly do begin to realize that He is not a ghost, but their Lord who has fulfilled all of His

promises, even the one about rising from the dead.

As we mentioned last week, fear is useless what is needed is trust, with this trust and the great gifts and knowledge given to us by the power of the Holy Spirit we can accomplish great things for and through the Risen Lord, so let's get started.

On Sunday, May 14, Mother's Day, we will have our annual May Crowning of the Blessed Mother in the Church at the 12 Noon Mass. Please plan to join us.

RESPECT LIFE

Last weekend after all the Masses, baby bottles were distributed, and we were asked to fill them with a little bit of change, each evening. This is just a reminder that they will be collected before all the Masses on the weekend of Mother's Day, May 13 and 14. You know that all the money collected in these symbolic containers will go to the Life Center which serves thousands of mothers each year – needless to say, this is a huge expense –and monetary support is vital. The Life Center depends on donations and the goodwill of people like you and me.

Abortion or adoption? South Dakota is the battleground now. This particular state has only 775,933 people, the USA's fifth least-populated state. But it has become the nation's battleground over whether abortion is the answer for women with unwanted pregnancies.

The most sweeping abortion ban in the country will go into effect there July 1st, unless blocked by a referendum petition now underway or by court order. The outcome ultimately may have national impact on the 1973 Roe v. Wade U.S. Supreme Court decision giving women the right to terminate pregnancy. That despite the fact that the numbers there, relatively speaking, are infinitesimal. Latest available figures:

>Annual abortions performed in South Dakota, just over 800.

>Annual abortions nationwide, 1.3 million.

In Rapid City, the states's second largest city with a population of 61,459, most are traditionally very conservative residents who favor the new abortion ban. But, in Sioux Falls, the largest city with a population of 136,695, pro-abortion advocates seem to have stronger support. The owner of the newspaper, USA TODAY, Al Neuharth and his wife Rachel are the adoptive parents of "six precious chosen children", as he puts it. His attitude is pro-choice, as he believes that a woman's right to privacy includes abortion; however, as he says: "the best possible outcome of this issue would be encouragement and support for pregnant women everywhere who are willing to carry an unwanted child to birth, and then finding proper adoptive parents."

Here's another view on abortion in South Dakota:

"My view is that South Dakotans know the difference between human rights and a *so-called right to privacy* that currently includes the right to kill another human being."

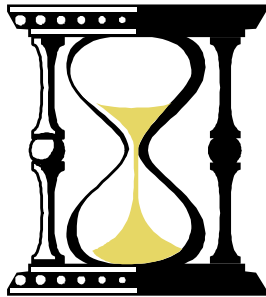

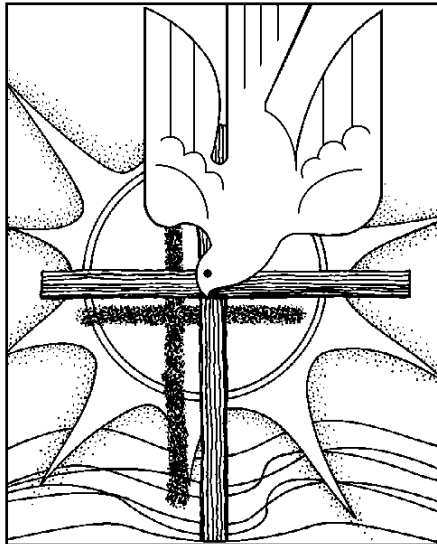
