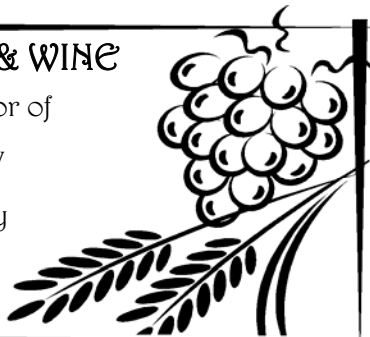

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

There is a story about a young man who had to get up before the members of his parish congregation and recite the 23rd Psalm. He had practiced reciting the Psalm for a long time and when the day came, he knew it backwards and forwards. As he got up in front of the congregation, all eyes were focused on him and he began to panic. After some time passed, he began with, "The Lord is my shepherd" and then he stopped! After a period of silence, which must have felt like a lifetime for the young man, he continued, "And that's all I need to know!" With that came a great deal of applause from the people. Now, were they applauding because they approved of his ability to think on his feet and save the day, or were they applauding him for his great insight-why does it have to be either or?

Today Jesus tells us (as He does every year on this **Good Shepherd Sunday**) that He is the Good Shepherd who knows His sheep and they know Him. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep so they can have life. This should be a great comfort for us, especially at times when we are tested. Why, we'll remember the relationship that a shepherd has with his sheep. In Jesus' day, they lived side by side, and the sheep will only come to the voice of their shepherd whom they feel completely safe with. The shepherd does not run away when the wolf comes or those who would steal the sheep. No, he stays and protects and redeems those who are lost. Our Lord, is telling us we can totally trust in Him, even more than the sheep on their shepherd, because He will go out of His way to find the lost sheep even to leaving the 99 behind to go out and save the lost one. That's great for the **ONE** lost sheep, but what about the **99**? Is the shepherd really going to leave them alone to go out and search for the one, so they too could get lost or make some wolf a lovely dinner (*mint jelly is optional*)? Of course not, the Good Shepherd never leaves His flock alone, and through the power of The Holy Spirit he is always present, and it is this same Holy Spirit who empowers others to shepherd the sheep in the Good Shepherd's name. Christ cares greatly for us His sheep, and He appoints shepherds over His Church to preach the good news, teach, heal and minister in the same way He did and still does (for the Good Shepherd came not to be served, but to serve and so do all of His shepherds who hear His voice).

Please pray for our shepherds: *Pope Benedict XVI*, our *Bishop William Murphy* and all of the Bishops of

the Church, *Fathers Thomas, Rene`, Boyle, Liu* and myself who have been given by God the great honor of serving the People of St. Joseph's. Pray for all of our *Deacons, James Altonji, Joseph Dougherty, Joseph Califano, Michael DeBellis, and Michael Devenney* who help the priests in their ministry and perform their own vital service to the Good Shepherd. Pray for *Lachlan and Lee* and their classmates as they continue to study for the Priesthood, and pray for *Mr. Frank Dell'Aglio and Mr. William Dobbins* as they study for the Diaconate for our parish and diocese. Please pray for an increase of vocations to the Priesthood, Diaconate, and Religious Life so that there will always be shepherds molded in the image and likeness of Jesus. Pray that all who shepherd will always be open to the grace, power and love of the Holy Spirit to serve in the name of and in the person of Christ.

Please pray for all of our young people who have received, are receiving and will receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the 1st time this year. May this wonderful event totally transform their lives and lives of their families to help them come closer and closer to God, to become the future leaders and shepherds of the Church.

Next Sunday, **Mother's Day, at the 12 Noon Mass** we will have our annual *May Crowning of the Statue of the blessed Mother in the Church*. We will invite our First Communion Children from this year to participate in this loving event.

RESPECT LIFE

It's been noted before, but bears repeating: Every income-tax paying citizen of the United States is supporting Planned Parenthood through their tax dollars. This outrageous

action is being challenged by the American Life League, a pro-life organization, which publishes the paper called ALL/News. In the April 2006 issue we learn that PP, in one year alone, received more than \$265 million in funding from federal, state and local governments. This fact angers pro-lifers, and spurs action to see that this funding stops.

Why is all this money being funneled into the coffers of the nation's largest abortion provider?

Now that South Dakota's Governor Mike Rounds has signed a law that would outlaw abortion in his state, except if the mother's life is threatened, which incidentally, Planned Parenthood plans to challenge, the legislators in five more states are considering bans that would severely limit or altogether prohibit abortions in their states. Those states are: Ohio, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, and Tennessee. One of these abortion bans may force the U.S. Supreme Court to reexamine Roe v. Wade and subsequently move the responsibility to uphold the inalienable right to life to the voters of each state.

Life News May 2006

Billboards for Life – have you seen them in your travels or heard of them? They are sponsored by Catholics for Children which is a lay apostolate which began in 1995 at St. Martin of Tours parish in Louisville, Kentucky. Their first fundraising effort to post pro-life billboards around town has since grown into Billboards for Life, a very successful campaign which continues to blanket cities and towns with Catholic pro-life messages. These messages are intended to raise public awareness of the sanctity of all human life. Over the past decade, the project has posted more than 1,600 billboards in southern Indiana, Louisville, Lexington and towns in central Kentucky. Some have been seen in Maryland, also. They give a simple message, such as a picture of a baby saying, "Thanks, Mom, for choosing Life" and a pregnancy help hotline phone number. Look for them in your travels.

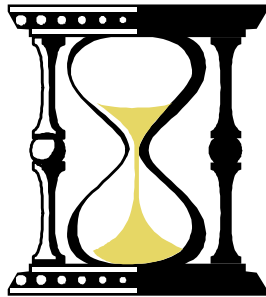

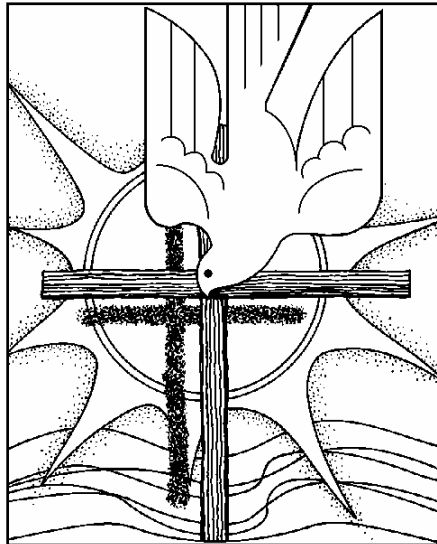

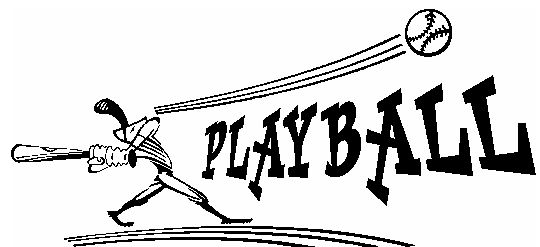
