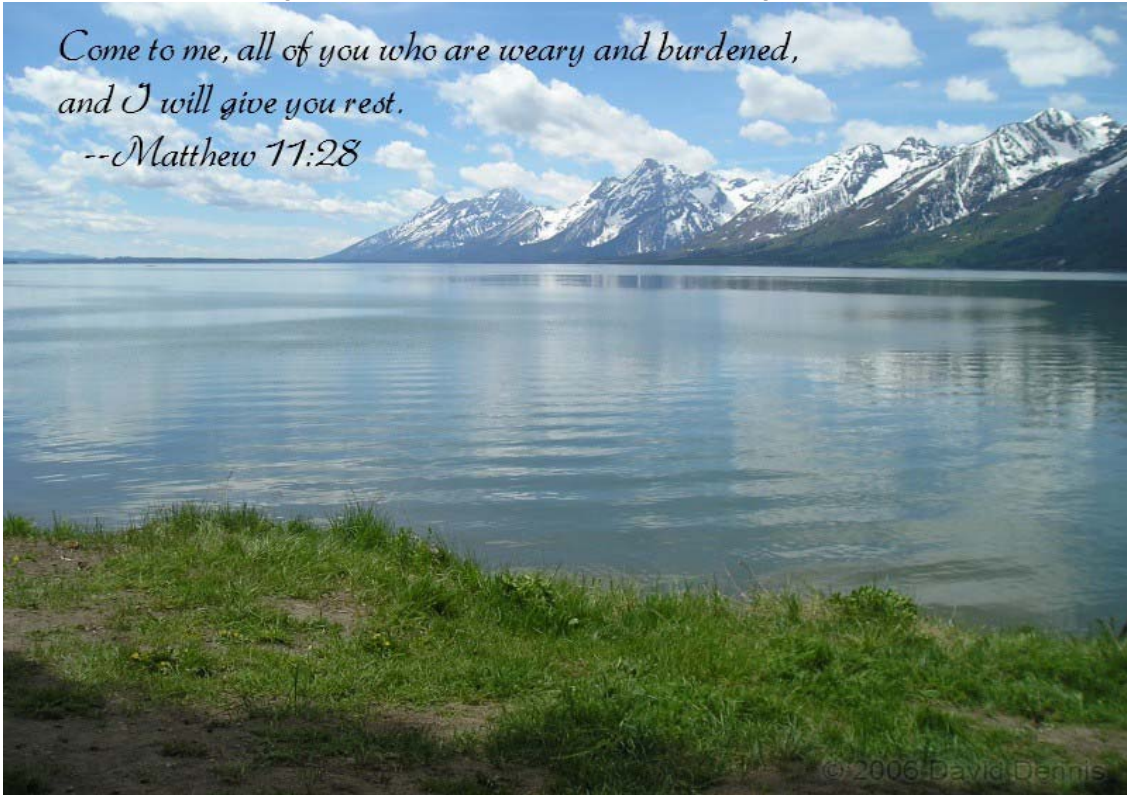

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE



Last weekend we saw in the *Solemnity of the Apostles Peter and Paul* some of the hardships that the Apostles had to undergo as they carried out their mission. As was pointed out, we too are called to preach the Good News no matter what hardships we might have to face. Today we are given a clear sign of how to deal with hardship, and how to continue spreading the Good News like Peter and Paul. We see it in the words of Jesus; “*Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest.*” Jesus is telling us that He is always here to help us, to comfort us, and to give us the strength to carry out our calling.

We can and will truly find rest for ourselves in Jesus if we try to accept all He wants to give us. This of course means being child like (**not childish**). To be child like means to be listening to everything and to be willing to take everything just like a little child (who wants to learn all about the world) does. It means to trust in Jesus and to follow wherever He wants to lead us, and not to be like those who are wise and learned. Now God has nothing against wisdom and learning, but Jesus is speaking about those who think they know it all; those who are so wise that they do not seek the **Wisdom of God**. Today (as in Jesus’ day) so many people believe that they, because they know the ways of the world, think they know everything that there is to know. But as St. Paul reminds us, **what is seen is**

transitory, but what is unseen lasts forever. Meaning to know only the things of the physical universe and think you know all that there is, is to know only half of what there is to know.

Again Christ calls us to be open to all He wants to give us and to let go of our fears and pre-conceived ideas and smugness and truly rest in Him; “*For my yoke is easy, and my burden light.*”

Don’t forget the **Summer Family Festival** is almost upon us; **July 16-20** just 10 days away. Come out and enjoy the fun, food, entertainment, rides, games and raffles including the nightly 50/50, basket, Grand Prize and **Mets Tickets Raffle**. Come join your parish family in having a great time and not have to use gasoline to get here. Have dinner at the festival and sit back, relax and enjoy. Also remember that on July 21st we will have **our Annual Golf Outing** to support our School and our Parish, come and join us.

We close today with a prayer of Offering of Self to Jesus: Receive, O Lord, all my liberty. Take my memory, my understanding, and my whole will. Whatever I have, whatever I possess, you have given to me. I restore it all to you. I yield it to be ruled directly by your will. Give me only your love and your grace, and I am rich enough; nor do I ask for more. Amen.

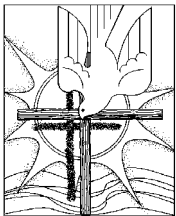

RESPECT LIFE LIFE COUNTS!

For the first time in United States history, the issue of personhood will be decided in a public forum. More than 131,000 citizens of the state of Colorado have endorsed a plan to put an initiative on the fall 2008 election ballot that would allow voters to extend the U.S. Constitution's protections to those who haven't been born yet.

The Secretary of State of Colorado verified that the 131,000 valid signatures were more than the 76,047 required to put the initiative on the ballot. **The proposed amendment states that "The term 'Person' or 'Persons' shall include any human from the time of fertilization."**

Pro-abortion groups like Planned Parenthood, NARAL and Pro-Choice Colorado are expected to fund a major campaign in opposition to the proposed amendment. In spite of this well-organized and well-financed opposition, the highly motivated pro-life grass-roots movement is expected to win in the fall. Let's all pray about that

STRANGE ALLIANCE

It doesn't make any sense. A leading foundation dedicated to funding research for a cure of breast cancer has been awarding grants to Planned Parenthood, the leading provider of abortion services in the United States. Numerous studies have shown that abortion can increase the risk of developing breast cancer.

It has been reported that chapters of the Komen Race for the Cure breast cancer group gave affiliates of Planned Parenthood \$711,485 from April 2005 to March 2006. During the 2006-2007 fiscal year, PP businesses receive \$726,445.

A representative of STOPP which is a watchdog group headed by Jim Sedlack, says the numbers are disturbing given that millions of pro-life Americans will participate in Komen events coming up. He urges pro-life advocates to disassociate themselves with Komen events until the organization's affiliates stop giving money to the abortion business.

In September of 2004, Eve Sanchez Silver, a medical research analyst and Hispanic outreach director of the Komen Foundation, resigned from her leadership position. She said, "I don't believe that the Komen Foundation can uphold and support and affirm life with one hand, and then give money to an organization that is responsible for killing people on the other."

The newly released Planned Parenthood 2006-2007 Annual Report shows that the abortion giant increased the number of abortions it performed from 264,943 in 2005 to 289,650 in 2006. Total revenues amounted to over one billion dollars with profits of \$112 million in 2006.

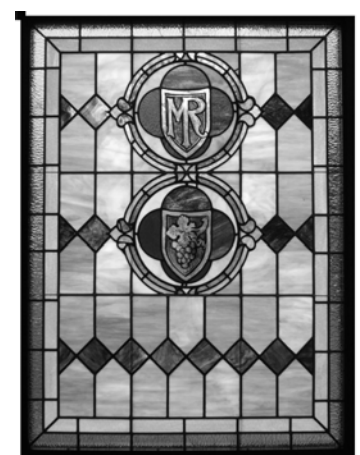
