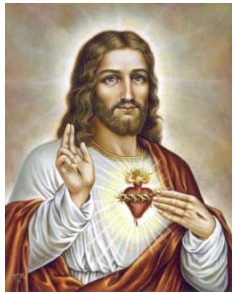

## St Joseph's Parish Monthly Recollection

On the First Friday of every month, at 7:30 PM, we hold our Monthly Parish Recollection. This is an hour of prayer, of recollection before our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament - whose Sacred Heart is the source of immense charity and generous love. The foundation of this prayer is God's presence in our souls as Creator, Preserver, and Author of Graces ("in Him we live, and move, and are" Acts 17:28). God is our Father, and our Friend and is our sweet Guest. We must acknowledge the realization of this great truth: God is in each of us, our soul is His Temple.

This prayer of recollection includes the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, Praying of the Psalms, Silence, Gospel Reading and a Talk /Reflection on the following topics: The Cardinal Virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude. The Theological Virtues of faith, hope and love. The gifts of the Holy Spirit; wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

*Every soul, hungry & thirsty for God, is invited to this holy hour every First Friday of the month to adore, venerate & contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, & to have a quiet dialogue with God.*

## Baptism

Celebrated most Sundays at 1:30pm. Please contact Parish Office when child is born to schedule Baptism Preparation requirements and date of Baptism.

## Confirmation

A parish program building on foundation laid by the School and Religious Education Program. There is a separate program for any adult or teenager who has not yet been confirmed. Those interested should contact the Parish Office.

## Marriage

Couples should contact the Parish Office to see one of the priests or deacons at least 6 months before the proposed wedding date, and before making any other arrangements. Both parties must complete marriage preparation programs before the marriage date. At least one of the parties must be registered in the parish.

## Anointing of the Sick

This is a Sacrament for the living. A Catholic should receive this Sacrament if they are chronically ill, or are about to undergo surgery and hospitalization, or are suffering the effects of advanced age. We celebrate it during a Special Mass each Spring and Fall. Reception of the Sacrament at other times can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office.

## Holy Orders

Anyone feeling called to the priesthood or religious life should feel free to contact one of the parish priests or deacons for guidance and direction.

## Interested in becoming a Catholic?

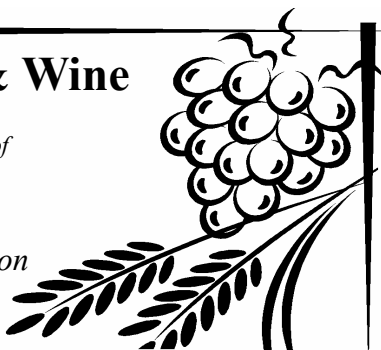

## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

*"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."* These words spoken by Our Lord, at the *Last Supper*, tell the Apostles that soon He will be taken away from them. These words, like the ones from last week's Gospel, are spoken by Jesus before He died on the Cross. They are, if you will, the final instructions given to the Apostles by the Earthly Jesus. But they are also words which are meant to reassure the Apostles that all will be all right after the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Last week Jesus told the Apostles and the Church that we must love as He has loved us, and this week He tells us a little more of how we can do this. He tells them and us not to be afraid for the Advocate will come to help us in everything.

The word **Advocate** is defined as someone who speaks on behalf of another person, especially in a legal context. Implicit in this definition, is the idea that the one who is represented lacks the knowledge, skill, ability or standing to speak for them self. In our society many people take on the title Advocate, this includes organizations, and newspapers, but Jesus is using the word different from these ideas. The Advocate is more than just a legal advisor or representative. Our Lord is telling us that the Holy Spirit will be like Him; He will take on the part of the sinner and saves them from the danger or loss of eternal life. The Holy Spirit will always be present to the Church to defend, guide and advise all of us. The Spirit abides in every believer and the Spirit takes the place of Christ's presence, while at the same time making Christ present (for they are both equally God). It is the Holy Spirit that helps us love as Jesus loved us and helps us make Christ present so we can carry on the work of the Good Shepherd.

***This Thursday is Ascension Thursday*** and it is a **Holy Day of Obligation**, which means we must mark this day with the celebration of Eucharist. Masses for this Holy Day are: Wednesday Evening at 7:30 PM, Thursday 7 and 9 AM, 12:10 PM, 5 PM and 7:30 PM.

Many think that this day marks the end of the Jesus story, as He ascends to Heaven to be with the Father, but it is only the end of one chapter and it leads us into the next chapter which has the Holy Spirit as our Advocate.

***On behalf of all of our Priests, Deacons, our Seminarian Michael Duffy, and the entire staff of St. Joseph's we wish all of our Mothers a very Happy Mother's Day.***

***Let us pray: Father at your Son's ascension into heaven you promised to send the Holy Spirit on your Apostles and your Church. You fill them with heavenly wisdom: fill us with the gifts of the Spirit. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen!***

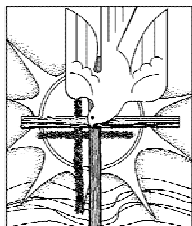

# Respect Life

In the Fall of 2009 a pro-life publication called Care Net (saving lives, healing hearts, ministering compassion) recounted how President Bush enacted regulations protecting conscience rights of doctors, nurses, and health care workers morally opposed to abortion. Now, in the Spring of 2010, under a new and less compassionate administration, things have changed. You have no doubt read about the nurses in a hospital in Nassau County and the situation they found themselves in when they objected to assisting with an abortion in that hospital. Because it was all so unfair to them, and their situation garnered so much publicity, their employer rescinded the discipline they were threatened with, and they were vindicated. That clash of medical-related work and a worker's conscience makes it clear that conscience protection must be part of health care. Medical personnel must not be forced to participate in procedures such as abortion, whether in the form of giving drugs such as RU-486 for a chemical abortion, or taking part in the actual procedure. And that should apply to pharmacists, too.

Some good news...The **Geron Corporation** had planned treatments of human spinal cord injuries with injections of embryonic stem cells. Coming from destroyed human embryos, the cells were to "help nerve fibers replace myelin – a fatty insulating substance that often gets stripped away when spines are injured – inhibiting the body's ability to transmit sensory signals." BUT – cheers to the **FDA** for shutting down the trials after cysts developed in animals who had received the treatment. Beyond moral objections to embryo destruction to obtain stem cells, there is an additional concern, and that is the development of uncontrollable tumors, called teratomas.

**Russia** is taking steps to reverse its plummeting population – the United Nations recently warned that Russia's population, currently estimated at somewhat over 140 million, could decline by one third in the next forty years. Some cities are sponsoring "a week without abortion", urging doctors not to perform abortions, and encouraging the population to have children. However, it may be a case of "too little, too late". Statistics show that there are routinely more abortions than live births in Russia. In fact, almost 70% of pregnancies end in abortion, despite public assistance for women who give birth.

This four-day retreat offers a time for prayer, conversation and scriptural reflections on virginity, purity and chastity. Girls will gain a deeper understanding of their worth and value to God, and each will consider His plan for her heart, mind, body and soul.

## **DAUGHTERS OF MARY RETREAT: A Note to Parents**

The point and purpose of this retreat is that young women gain a solid grasp of their worth and value, counter to the messages and images they receive through contemporary secular culture. Given a clear understanding of *who* they are in the eyes of God, they may make informed decisions about how and to whom they give their hearts, minds, bodies and souls.

### April 10 & 24: VIRGINITY

The first two days of the retreat will present the spiritual reality of virginity as derived from scriptural teachings, contrasted with the secular construction of virginity and femininity that advances the agenda of the culture of death. That agenda will be clearly delineated from God's plan for life and happiness. The value and power of the virginal womb will be introduced in discussion of Mary and will conclude with a film presentation of the story St. Philomena.

### May 8: PURITY & MODESTY

Day three of the retreat will commence with an explanation of the soul turned toward God and that of the soul turned away from God. We shall discuss how we may be led away from God by seductive images and messages encountered in mainstream culture and how to become more selective and sensitive to the images and messages we permit to enter our consciousness, concluding with a discussion of what we can do to preserve and cultivate purity in ourselves.

### May 22: CHASTITY

On day four we will discuss love as defined in scripture and the meaning and practice of chastity for single, married and consecrated women according to the teachings of the Catholic Church. Participants will be encouraged to consider the vocation to which God is calling them. We will end with a film presentation of the life of St. Gianna Molla who exemplified perfect marital chastity.

Every meeting shall be begun and ended with prayer.

**This retreat is presented as a gift to the parish by a female parishioner holding degrees in philosophy and psychology, who is preparing to enter the religious life. She has led the Way of Love prayer/support group at the Shrine of our Lady of the Island, taught scripture there and given retreat talks on Mary the Mother of Jesus.**

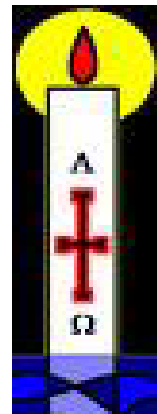

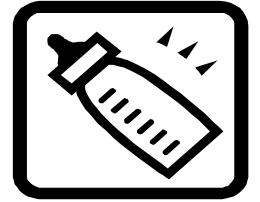
