Our Lady of Fatima Devotion

Monday Exposition and Benediction

Every Monday afternoon the Blessed Sacrament is exposed from 2:00 PM until 7:00 PM. This opportunity for prayer ends with Benediction beginning at about 6:45 PM and ending at 7:00 PM

First Friday Holy Hour

Every First Friday of the month we have a Holy Hour before the exposed Blessed Sacrament. This prayer runs from 7:30 PM until 8:30 PM, closing with Benediction.

St Joseph Men's Prayer Group

We meet every Tuesday evening at 7:30 PM in the Church where we pray the Rosary. Afterward we move to the main vestibule for coffee, donuts and fellowship. This is a great opportunity to be strengthened in your commitment as a Catholic man just by spending time with others like you!

Our church opens at 6:30 AM and remains open all day for anyone who wants to make a prayerful visit. Please come and have some quiet time with God in the midst of our busy (and sometimes loud) world.

The Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament is celebrated on Sundays at 1:30 PM and on the first Saturday of each month. Parents, please call the parish office to arrange a meeting with a priest.

The Sacrament of Eucharist

The Sacrament of Confirmation

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is for the living. We celebrate this Sacrament each Spring and Fall for those who are chronically ill, advanced in age, or who are about to undergo surgery or hospitalization. We can arrange the Sacrament at other times by calling the Parish Office.

OUR LITURGY

Isaiah prophesies a sign for Israel: The virgin shall conceive, and bear a son who will embody God's redemptive presence with his people. Paul, recalling his own apostolic calling, writes that the Gentiles are also called to belong to Jesus Christ. In the Gospel, the Lord's angel comes to Joseph in a dream and reveals the circumstances of Mary's pregnancy, and what this means. Joseph obeys the angel's commands.

It Sure Is Challenging To Try To Be A Holy Family These Days!

Next Sunday is the Feast of the Holy Family - Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We look at them and can say to ourselves, I can never be like them. They are perfect! Well, they did face some challenges that some of us can possibly relate to:

- A surprise pregnancy
- Serious travel problems
- Circumstances beyond their control forcing them to move
- The intense anxiety of a missing child

Knowing that they faced these kinds of problems may help us to relate to them. But there are challenges in our world that they never dealt with.

Here is an abbreviated version of a story by Beth Whitehouse reported in Newsday on November 19, 2019

In a freshman seminar at Adelphi University called "Life Unplugged", professor Donna Freitas required her students to surrender their phones for a week. The point was for the students to reflect on the question: "What does it mean to live constantly interrupted?"

Some immediate reactions: hands shaking and getting really sweaty.

Things they learned:

How annoying it is when others use smartphones. One felt completely out of touch with friends at a meal while they constantly texted. Eventually, they realized she was phoneless and put theirs away. This led to a nice conversation. Another got very annoyed while playing a video game and his friend paused the game for every alert his phone gave him. One came to the conclusion, maybe I need to leave my phone at home or put it away while I am out with friends.

How much their phones disturb their sleep. They found themselves going to sleep at a more sensible hour and not having their sleep interrupted by buzzing alerts. One said she hopes to keep her phone in another room at night from now on, but she is not sure she will be able to keep to this promise.

How much faster they work without the distractions. One student got an entire research paper done in just over two days. Another plans to hand her phone to someone while studying.

How freeing it can be not to have constant access to social media. Snapchat keeps records of "streaks" of daily communication. One student had a streak of 1,400 days – more than three years. Notifications from apps like these tempt you to constantly look at your phone. After a week off, some phones took more than five minutes to upload all the notifications they missed. Some students decided to turn off their notifications.

How much they count on phones for things that have nothing to do with phones. One almost missed out on selfies with wax statues of famous people at Madame Tusaud's in NYC. Luckily friends had phones to take her picture. Another, without GPS, finally had to pay attention to figure out how to get to school on her own. But one, who didn't trust his ability to set an ordinary alarm clock, had anxious, interrupted sleep.

How much their parents also rely on the students' phones. One dad gave his daughter an old phone for the week that could only dial 911, so he could continue to use his app to keep track of her. One mom who texted her son throughout the day learned to email him once a day – he found it much better this way.

How dependent their social lives are on their phones. Most felt very disconnected – they missed out on some social engagements because friends use phones and social media to connect.

How addicted they really are. One baby-sat for cousins at a park and actually played with them instead of sitting on the swing texting. Another plans to leave it in her car when out with friends. She says, "I didn't think I as addicted, but this made me realize I really am. If it is in front of me, I am going to use it."

Maybe as the calendar turns to 2020, families could look at their use of smartphones and social media - just to see where it may be getting in the way of one of the greatest gifts we can give each other - our presence!

Giving Out Of Love, Not Guilt

This time of year we all get bombarded with requests for assistance. Many requests are based on guilt, not on love: the request at the register in the store; the many mailings with free gifts or stamped return envelopes enticing you to not waste a stamp; even pictures of people in need, hoping to tug at our heart strings.

All of these organizations that beg do good work, but no one person can help them all. I have two **very strong suggestions** regarding these requests:

Make a decision about which charity (or charities) you will support for the year. Commit to them and politely say, "I'm sorry" to the others - no guilt because you are helping someone else.

Choose a charity that helps to make changes in the situations of those in need. The ideal gift is the one that will help lift a person out of chronic need. Helping others should be a response to the goodness we have experienced from God, not in order to assuage our guilt or make us feel good for a few minutes. -Fr Mike


